THE WORK

- **Receive shipments:** Accept incoming freight, verify quantities against paperwork, inspect for damage, and log data accurately into the ERP system.
- **Route materials:** Label all incoming stock and transport it to its proper location in the warehouse, inspection zone, or production floor.
- **Manage inventory:** Run regular cycle counts and maintain organized inventory records that the production team can fully trust.
- **Log logistics:** Prepare and secure outbound shipments for customers and outside manufacturing processing vendors.
- **Maintain quality:** Follow strict quality, traceability, and documentation standards for all aerospace materials.
- **Support facilities:** Pitch in on general facility upkeep, warehouse organization, and occasional local business errands.

- **Work experience:** 2 to 4 years of general work experience. We will train you on our specific processes.
